People in the opposite lane even stopped, got out of their vehicles and removed their hats, held their hands over their hearts, saluted.....an amazing show of patriotism and respect!

We wound around the local communities for about 2 hours before stopping in Cornelia for gas and a snack. Leaving Cornelia, all but one of us got separated from the main column. So we took a shortcut to Cleveland, GA., and finally caught up with the parade as we climbed Blood Mountain. From there we followed the group to the Copperhead Lodge in Blairsville where they hosted the entire group with a pulled pork BBQ sandwich lunch.

As I rode with this great group of fellow bikers and saw the love and emotion coming from the crowds, I couldn't help but to reflect and remember what happened on that awful day 18 years ago. I'm proud to have done this ride for four years now and find it humbling and emotional. I plan to do it again in 2020! Come join me!
